NJ police stated: "In the area
involving cultural diversity and
minority instruction, the trooper
recruits received extensive and

detailed instruction from experts outside of the state police, including representatives from groups and organizations such as the Anti-Defamation League and other ethnic, cultural and professional organizations."

The ADL was among the first civil rights groups in New Jersey to condemn the practice of racial profiling. ADL regional director Charles "Shai" Goldstein said, "In order to promote a culture that has a zero-tolerance policy for any manifestation of bigotry, diversity training is essential."

After a series of workshops, A World of Difference Institute conducted a two-week intensive Train the Trainer program with the state police.
