THE ANTI-DEFAMATION  
League's A World of Difference  
Institute Law Enforcement  
Training Program has been an  
integral part of the New Jersey  
State Police's new training pro-  
gram. A press release issued by the  
NJ police stated: "In the area  
involving cultural diversity and  
minority instruction, the trooper  
recruits received extensive and

detailed instruction from experts  
outside of the state police, includ-  
ing representatives from groups  
and organizations such as the  
Anti-Defamation League and  
other ethnic, cultural and profes-  
sional organizations."

The ADL was among the first  
civil rights groups in New Jersey to  
condemn the practice of racial  
profiling. ADL regional director  
Charles "Shai" Goldstein said, "In  
order to promote a culture that  
has a zero-tolerance policy for any  
manifestation of bigotry, diversity  
training is essential."

After a series of workshops, A  
World of Difference Institute con-  
ducted a two-week intensive Train  
the Trainer program with the state  
police.
